

The winter varieties should be sown in August, and lifted before severe frost. A warm sandy loam, made rich and light by some well rotted manure, will be most likely to afford them brittle and free from worms.

RHUBARE—*Rhubarbe*, Fr. *Rhubarber*, Ger.

Sow the seed early in spring in rows twelve inches apart in good rich soil, and the following Spring transplant into rows two feet apart each way, manure the ground to the depth of two feet. In raising Rhubarb from seeds, no reliance can be placed on their producing the true varieties. The most expeditious and satisfactory mode to procure a supply, is to procure roots already grown, which will produce a moderate supply the first season; the roots will last many years by manuring them every fall, and covering the crowns of the plant with light litter.

SALSIFY OR VEGETABLE OYSTER—*Salsify*, Fr. *Hafenwurz*, Ger.

LONG WHITE..... per oz. 20 cents.

Sow early in Spring, in drills twelve inches apart, one inch deep, and thin out to six inches in the row; cultivate similar to Carrots and Parsnips. The roots are boiled or stewed like Parsnips, or half boiled or grated fine, made in small flat balls and dipped into a batter and fried like oysters, which they strongly resemble in flavor. They are quite hardy, and will stand the winter in the open ground.

SCORZONERA—*Scorzonere*, Fr. *Scorzonierwurz*, Ger.

Cultivate and use in the same way as Salsify.

SKIRRET—*Chervis*, Fr. *Zuckerwurz*, Ger.

Sow in drills half an inch deep, and a foot apart; thin out to six inches in the row; cultivate same as Carrots, and use in the same manner.

Sow early in Spring, in drills one foot apart, and thin out to six inches in the row. Rich light soil is requisite to produce large tender leaves. For winter crop sow end of August; cover lightly with clean straw; soak the seed six hours before sowing.

SEA KALE—*Chou Mari*, Fr. *Meerkohl*, Ger.

Sow in drills one foot apart, and thin out to four inches in the row. When one year old transplant them into hills eighteen inches apart, and three plants to each hill. On the approach of frost, cover about two feet thick with dried leaves; are fit for use when the shoots are four inches long and thoroughly blanched—by many esteemed superior to Asparagus.
