CALANDRINIA SPECIOSA ALBA: Too much cannot be said in praise of this novelty, which is a pure white variety of the popular *C. speciosa*; the very dwarf habit of this variety, in conjunction with the pure white of the flowers, must necessarily make it very useful for the edgings of beds, rockeries, and also as a pot plant.....per packet, 10 cts.

CANDYTUFT, very dwarf white, [*Iberis affinis*] [*Vilmorin's*,] first class [annual and biennia]; from 4 to 7 inches high, producing large compact tufts 7 to 9 inches long; finely-cut leaves which are when the plants is in bloom, almost completely covered with a multitude of brilliant white flowers, slightly sweet scented.
